


Ag & Grazing Management

Agriculture Lease Revenues: \$18,569,680

- 7,551,637 bushels of wheat
- 1,522,192 bushels of barley
- 175,532 tons of hay

Grazing Revenues: \$16,840,669

\$/AUM increased from \$13.16 to \$16.53 as a result of an increase in beef cattle prices. Ag & Grazing Revenues





Mineral Revenues



Forest Management

- 54 million board feet (MMBF) sold of the 60.3 million offered for sale
- Stumpage value of \$9.8 million
- Average stumpage price increased 2% from FY23 to \$182 per thousand board feet (MBF)
- 42 MMBF harvested generating \$9.8 million in revenue
- Planted 556,680 seedlings on State Trust Lands
- Put over 13,000 acres under active management






Recreational Use Program

Recreational Use Revenue \$2,328,512

- General Recreational Use and Conservation Licenses: \$2,115,952
- Special Recreational Use Licenses: \$212,559
- Overall recreational use revenue up 25%

Fiscal Year 2024 Summary

- \$92,364,160 distributed to Common Schools K-12.
- School Facility & Technology Account was \$32,084,554 due to payment of back rent for the Avista Hydro dam lease.
- Recreational Use revenue increased by 25% following the legislative change to conservation licenses in the 2025 session.
