STATE CLAIMS FILING

State of Montana Claims. Claims arising under the jurisdiction of the State of Montana are negotiated by the responsible line officer or his or her designee, who must be on the DNRC Approved Signers List. State of Idaho Claims. Settlements arising under the jurisdiction of the State of Idaho must be submitted in writing to the IDL host agency. The IDL host agency will submit the claim documentation to the Fire Business Program Manager, Bureau of Fire Management, who may settle the claim or forward it to Risk Management for final determination. Claims may also be submitted in writing to the Fire Business Program Manager, Bureau of Fire Management, 3284 West Industrial Loop, Coeur d'Alene, ID, 83815-6021; office phone: (208) 769-1525. State of North Dakota Claims. Claims against the state must be presented in writing to the Director of Office of Management and Budget. The claim must be filed within 180 days of when the alleged injury or property damage was discovered. State of South Dakota Claims. FEDERAL CLAIMS FILING
